
In this regulatory action, the Physical Therapy Board of California (the Board) is proposing to adopt two new sections and amend one section in Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations. These provisions would require licensees to submit a full set of fingerprints to the Department of Justice as a condition of license renewal. Licensees would also be required to disclose to the Board their criminal history information, the existence of any settlement, judgment or arbitration award of over \$3,000 for which they were subject to, and whether they have been denied a license or disciplined by another licensing authority.

OAL disapproves this regulatory action for the following reason(s):

The disapproved regulations fail to comply with the Clarity and Necessity standards of Government Code section 11349.1, failed to follow the required procedure, and failed to summarize and adequately respond to each comment made regarding the proposed action.

Within seven (7) calendar days of the date of this notice, the Office of Administrative Law will send the adopting agency a written decision detailing the reason(s) for disapproval of this regulatory filing. Pursuant to Government Code section 11349.4, the adopting agency may resubmit the regulation(s) within 120 calendar days of receipt of that written decision.
