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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What happens when one of the people who has taken an oath to protect the public finds themselves in the position of the public? As the president of the Physical Therapy Board of California (PTBC), I am now a patient and receiving services from a licensed practitioner. As my mother used to say, “Things look different when the rabbit’s got the gun, huh?” She was right about that saying. However, the outcome is quite different in my situation. My physical therapist is amazing. She and all the other practitioners in the physical therapy office are professionals who take their roles seriously and compassionately.

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From the front desk to the exercise space, the team is exemplary and just what PTBC and the public expect from physical therapists and physical therapist assistants licensed in our state.

As a Board member, one of my roles is to protect the public from the incompetent, unprofessional, and criminal practice of physical therapy. This means that while my physical therapist may have the kindest disposition, she must have professional training and education in addition to her demeanor to meet the standards required in the practice. Furthermore, she must complete 30 hours of continuing competency courses every two years. Licensure is a big deal. The safety of each patient is an even bigger deal. of license to practice. Therefore, the hours and days that I spend giving my attention to reviewing patient complaints and other issues are critical to the role that I took an oath to uphold.

The right to practice physical therapy is a privilege granted by the state of California. More so, every patient has the right to be protected from any unprofessional, improper, incompetent, unlawful, fraudulent, or deceptive practice of physical therapy. It is the law. So now that I must remove my president's hat and wear a patient's hat, it gives me relief and confidence knowing that the hands of the person who is helping me correct my posture and working on my injured arm, belong to someone competent, educated, licensed, and qualified to practice physical therapy. Yes, mom things do look different when the rabbit's got the gun, and boy, am I glad about it this time!

DO WE HAVE YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS?

Licensees are required to provide PTBC with an email address if the licensee has one. Email is an efficient conduit for sharing information between PTBC and its applicants and licensees. PTBC will be able to communicate regarding the status of applications, renewals, and other service requests; provide law and regulation updates; and disseminate important PTBC news directly to each applicant and licensee—from PTBC to your door (or email inbox). It doesn't get much easier! PTBC hopes this accelerated delivery and exchange of information will decrease processing



times in all aspects of PTBC programs and facilitate licensees keeping apprised of laws and regulations and PTBC activities. Moreover, with the transition to the BreEZe system, email will be the standard method of communication. You can submit/update your email address using BreEZe or submit your address change with BreEZe. You may also submit your email address in writing to PTBC—please include your name and license number.

PTBC convenes in public meetings to conduct business, make regulatory and enforcement decisions, and to address other issues within PTBC’s jurisdiction.

Physical therapists (PTs) and physical therapist assistants (PTAs) licensed by PTBC may earn continuing competency hours for attending Board meetings in

person. This encourages licensees to learn more about the issues and operations of PTBC.

Can’t attend a meeting? While you won’t receive continuing competency credit, you can still view the meeting actions via webcast. Become a Facebook friend of PTBC and you’ll receive notification and a link to gain access on the meeting day.

Who is the Physical Therapy Board of California?

PTBC is a government agency within the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA). PTBC licenses and disciplines physical therapists and physical therapist assistants. PTBC provides three principal types of consumer services:

- Verifies education and background prior to licensure.
- Provides information about the practice of physical therapy by physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.
- Investigates complaints against physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.

Board Meetings

The state mandates PTBC to hold three Board meetings a year. Typically, PTBC conducts four meetings a year in the areas of Northern and Southern California. Board meetings are usually two days long and PTBC strongly encourages the public to attend.

Benefits of Hosting a Board Meeting

- Consumers in the area can be educated on the practice of physical therapy.
- Licensees in the area can attend and receive continuing competency credit while having their voice heard on topics being discussed.
- Students and applicants can attend in between classes and learn how PTBC operates and how decisions are made that affect the profession.
- Name recognition for the hosting location.

To advance and protect the interests of the people of California by the effective administration of the Physical Therapy Practice Act.

PROFESSIONAL BOARD MEMBER ADVICE

DR. DAYLE ARMSTRONG:

Q: What advice would you give high school students thinking about entering the profession?

Volunteer at a hospital or physical therapy clinic to learn and understand what the profession is about. Attend career day presentations at your school.

Q: What advice would you give physical therapy students?

Be open minded about all practice areas in the profession. Take advantage of learning opportunities in the classroom, the clinic, and internships.

Q: What advice would you give new grads about the exams?

Make a study calendar and be disciplined to stick with it! Study independently and in study groups. Do not dismiss any areas as not important to the Board.

Q: What is the one piece of advice you wish you would have gotten while going through the process of getting licensed?

Know that PTBC is available as a resource. Attend a presentation where the staff educates you on the complete application process and all the steps you will need to know and complete.

Q: What advice would you give to a licensee who has had a complaint brought against them?

Breathe deeply! Provide information requested and be complete and thorough. Laws and regulations uphold the Board's mandate to process complaints efficiently. PTBC aims to protect consumers and to fairly review any complaint of the services and practices of a physical therapist.

Q: What inspired you to become a physical therapist?

I was a volunteer at my community hospital at age 12. I was assigned to help in the physical therapy department one day and I knew from that moment I wanted to be a physical therapist. I graduated high school early, by two years to begin my physical therapy education journey. Physical therapy is an amazing profession with endless opportunities to help individuals and make a positive impact on people's lives.

Q: What would you be doing now if you were not a physical therapist?

I would be a weather forecaster/meteorologist. I love studying and learning about weather patterns around the world.

DR. ALICIA RABENA-AMEN:

Q: What advice would you give high school students thinking about entering the profession?

Volunteer at local clinics and hospitals to learn and observe physical therapists in practice.

Q: What advice would you give physical therapy students?

Don't just learn psychomotor skills. Practice with your classmates as if they were your patients so that you can connect more easily with them using laymen's terms and empathy.

Q: What is one thing you wish you could go back to physical therapy school and do over again?

I wish I had paid more attention to developing my professional persona.

Q: What advice would you give to new grads about the exams?

Get a study buddy and teach each other the material you are studying. If you really want to learn something, teach it.

Q: What is the one piece of advice you wish you would have gotten while going through the process of getting licensed?

Be patient—it takes a while to receive notification that you are licensed.

Q: What advice would you give to a licensee who has had a complaint brought against them?

Be transparent, reflective, remorseful, and cooperative with the Board; it might reflect favorably on you.

Q: What inspired you to become a physical therapist?

I wanted to be a nurse, then went through physical therapy and found it was a closer fit to the health care path I wanted to pursue.

Q: What would you be doing now if you were not a physical therapist?

If I wasn't a physical therapist, I would probably work in a clinical laboratory as a clinical laboratory scientist.

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DR. KAREN BRANDON:

Q: What advice would you give high school students thinking about entering the profession?

Physical therapy is a wonderful profession that has many advantages. It is important that you get to see the different roles in health care and observe how they serve the patients and the community. Shadow more than one profession so you can see which ones you can see yourself doing as well as has different settings.

Q: What advice would you give physical therapy students?

Become a part of research whenever you can. Participate in professional conferences. Learn how to present in front of people because even the smallest talk for a high school, a church, or another group of students helps you get better as a communicator and supports more people understanding the benefits of physical therapy. Get involved with volunteer clinic opportunities here and abroad.

Q: What is one thing you wish you could go back to physical therapy school and do over again?

Spend more time with very interesting faculty.

Q: What advice would you give to new grads about the exams?

Your classes have taught you the standards, and the clinicals taught you the application. If you have been keeping up with your understanding of the material and experiences you have been exposed to, then you are ready to do well on the exam. Study guides are wonderful to give you reminders of content areas you may have had less exposure to. When you are wondering about a concept ASK SEVERAL PEOPLE, and after you ask, look up the support for their answers in your references, make sure they are current evidence. After deciding the answer you like, explain it to someone else.

Q: What is the one piece of advice you wish you would have gotten while going through the process of getting licensed?

When I was licensed, each step took longer. Now so much is automated. I think overall I would have appreciated some form of parameters for how long each step takes and maybe an outline of all the applicant deadlines. Luckily, we have that

on our website now! So, I think I would say best advice is “Be complete the first time, get your stuff in early and be patient—this time is a short piece of your career!”

Q: What advice would you give to a licensee who has had a complaint brought against them?

I would say, first get clarification what exactly the complaint was; it doesn't mean everything you have ever done is wrong. It is usually specific to something that was expected and may or may not require disciplinary investigation. Second, I would say, be honest and open to answering questions and providing information. Even if there is something you did that was non-compliant, the goal of professional regulations is to reduce things that harm the public, it isn't punitive or personal when doing that. The Board recognizes people make errors and also knows that professionals can make mistakes, learn and grow because we know that each licensee is part of the same community, and we want a thriving health care system where each provider takes their role seriously and is happy to do their job.

Q: What inspired you to become a physical therapist?

In my early elementary years, I was interested in medicine, but didn't want what I thought came with the physician lifestyle. I went to undergrad for research-based psychology and learned I enjoyed problem solving. In my second year of college I shadowed a PT and found that I could work with individuals and restore their health mentally and physically and the focus was not pharmacological or surgical but was based on my ability to optimize their systems naturally and I would have to solve problems and know the body functions so well I could find any barrier, missing link, to improve the person's condition. I would even have to figure out the steps to get there and fill in missing parts with adaptations. I really aspired to have that ability and impact. The rewards of being a critical part of someone's journey and changing lives is a huge bonus.

Q: What would you be doing now if you were not a physical therapist?

Maybe I would be a journalist, a high school teacher, or a psychologist.

CHANGES TO THE CAL LAW EXAM

PTBC is thrilled to announce that the California Law Exam has transitioned to the CAL-JAM (Jurisprudence Assessment Module)! This change, effective as of July 1, brings benefits to both licensees and applicants.

The CAL-JAM is an online, on-demand jurisprudence tool that not only ensures applicants and licensees understand the laws and regulations governing the practice of physical therapy in California, but also serves as a learning tool. It is designed to be more accessible and user-friendly, allowing applicants and licensees to take the exam online at their convenience.

Check out all the details and fantastic benefits that the CAL-JAM provides below!

CAL-JAM Facts:

- The CAL-JAM has 50 questions, and the duration of the exam is 90 minutes.
- The price to take the CAL-JAM is \$50.
- You can register whenever you are ready to take the CAL-JAM.
- The CAL-JAM must be completed within 96 hours of purchase.
- Takers will need their Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) ID to register for the CAL-JAM.
- Takers are required to answer 80% of the questions correctly to pass the CAL-JAM. There is no limit on the number of attempts.

Benefits of the CAL-JAM include:

- Licensees can take the CAL-JAM from anywhere online to meet the two hours in ethics, laws and regulations requirement (CCR 1399.93) without having to go through the process to register at a prometric site and paying that extra fee.
- The total cost to take the CAL-JAM (\$50) is about half the price of the previous Cal Law Exam (\$95).
- Ensures licensees and applicants taking the exam understand the laws and regulations governing the practice of physical therapy and serves as a learning tool as well as an exam.
- No more having to take the exam at a prometric center for applicants. Instead, the applicant logs into their FSBPT customer account and registers for immediate access to take the CAL-JAM remotely.
- Feedback is immediately provided during the exam.
- If someone answers a question incorrectly, they are given a list of the laws and regulations supporting the question and have another opportunity to answer the question one more time.
- The purpose is to ensure that the applicant or licensee learns about the laws and regulations, and not just knows enough to achieve a passing score.



STAFF SPOTLIGHT: ENFORCEMENT EDITION

BEATRIZ REYNOSO

Beatriz Reynoso is a long-time member of the PTBC family and has been an amazing talent to work with. She takes her job seriously, and her attention to detail is second to none. But she is also approachable, friendly, and does not hesitate to stop what she's doing to help someone out. Earlier this year, Beatriz received the Silver Level Superior Accomplishment Award for her many outstanding contributions, which have been instrumental in fulfilling PTBC's mandate of consumer protection.

Q: How long have you been with PTBC?

Almost 18 years.

Q: Where did you work before coming to PTBC?

PTBC was my very first job. I started a few months after my high school graduation.

Q: Have you always worked in the Enforcement Unit?

No, when I first started with PTBC I worked in the Applications Unit assisting the analysts with clerical work for almost three years.

Q: If you were not an enforcement analyst for PTBC, what would you be doing?

Most likely I would have pursued a career as a paralegal.

Q: Walk me through your day at work.

On a routine day, I begin my workday with responding to emails and listening to voicemails. I then go through my case load and work on the higher priority matters that need immediate attention. Once all those matters have been taken care of, I move onto lower priority assignments, such as follow up requests. I also answer phone calls and emails throughout my day. I finish the day with a brief review of my case load and prepare a list of matters that should be taken care of the following workday.

Q: What do you find the most rewarding about what you do?

What is most rewarding to me is the assistance that I get to provide to both consumers and licensees, as well as their appreciation in receiving that assistance. Our priority is consumer protection; however, in doing that, I have had the opportunity of assisting licensees as well.

Q: What is the most difficult part of your job?

I would say it is when I complete a thorough investigation of a complaint and the consumer is left unsatisfied with the final decision or the action taken by PTBC.

Q: What advice would you give to a consumer when filing a complaint?

When submitting a complaint, please provide as much detail as possible. Even if you feel the information is pointless or wouldn't matter, please add it in. We appreciate all the details and extra information. Also, feel free to give us a call when you are filling out the complaint and have any questions or concerns. We are happy to assist you in the process and want to make it as easy as possible for you.

Q: What advice would you give to a licensee who has had a complaint filed against them?

Do not be alarmed when you are made aware a complaint has been filed against you. Please understand when a staff member from our unit reaches out to you, we are simply attempting to gather all the necessary information and documentation to understand what truly occurred. Please provide timely responses to any information that is being requested to avoid delaying our processing of your case. Lastly, it is very important to be cooperative with PTBC, as well as open and honest in your responses during our investigations. Always feel free to contact your assigned analyst to assist you with any questions or concerns you have during the investigation of your case.

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Q: What does consumer protection mean to you?

To me it means assisting any member of the public, whether it be a patient or another health care professional, in preventing any type of future harm, or future violation of the Physical Therapy Practice Act, by completing a thorough and detailed investigation of all complaints.

DAVID LAXTON

David Laxton is also a long-time member of the PTBC family who has shared his many skills and strengths with us over the years. David is known for his laid-back friendly demeanor with co-workers, and he is always first to come to anyone's aide. David also wrote an informative article about the effects a conviction can have on a physical therapy license, and it was featured in a recent PTBC newsletter. David is a positive influence on both co-workers and consumers, as he handles the difficulties of the job with grace, careful efficiency, and understanding.

Q: How long have you been with PTBC?

I started in April of 2006 as a student assistant, so over 18 years now!

Q: Where did you work before coming to PTBC?

I was relatively fresh out of high school having graduated less than a year before. At the time I was working as an assistant manager and barista at It's a Grind Coffee House while I was sending out applications to several DCA boards and bureaus.

Q: Have you always worked in the Enforcement Unit?

No, my student assistant position was at the mail desk. After that I did work for our licensing unit and our cashiering desk before moving into the Board's Enforcement program.

Q: If you were not an enforcement analyst for PTBC, what would you be doing?

I think I would have set my sights on a position with the Office of Information Services. I was happy to play the part of unofficial IT personnel for PTBC in the past and I'm sure I would have been interested in pursuing that field of work had I not made the transition to the Enforcement Unit.

Q: Walk me through your day at work.

A typical day at work for me involves responding to emails and voicemails that I may have received the day prior. After that, I will revisit complaint cases that I have flagged for some follow up review or action. The rest of the day involves working on the desk investigations for my assigned case load, forwarding cases to the Division of Investigation, preparing completed cases for action or closure, and other tasks that require my attention that are non-case-related. There is always plenty to do!

Q: What do you find the most rewarding about what you do?

The most rewarding aspect of my work is knowing the service I provide to consumers has a direct impact on the level of service they receive from their health care providers. Physical therapy can be a difficult and painful process, and knowing that we are helping to improve that experience for people who are already in a vulnerable state is very rewarding.

Q: What is the most difficult part of your job?

Hearing some of the stories that consumers will tell when I am speaking to them on the phone. Unfortunately, misconduct by our licensees happens, and it is not uncommon for patients to be physically or psychologically affected by their experiences. When engaging in a difficult conversation with a consumer, I try to be patient, helpful, and reassuring so that they feel safe in sharing their experiences with me.

Q: What advice would you give to a consumer when filing a complaint?

The biggest piece of advice I would give consumers is to send in any information or documentation that you feel would help the Board investigate your complaint. Even if you are not sure it will be relevant, it may be of assistance to PTBC. We review everything that is provided with a consumer complaint, so don't hesitate to send in anything that may be related, no matter how inconsequential it may seem to you.

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Q: What advice would you give to a licensee who has had a complaint filed against them?

My advice to our licensees would be to familiarize yourself with the complaint process by visiting our website at www.ptbc.ca.gov and to respond promptly to any requests the Board makes. Investigating complaints can be a lengthy process, and we understand that having that investigative cloud hanging over you can leave you feeling anxious and upset, so knowing what the process entails and understanding that you can contact the Board for updates on any cases can help navigate the process.

Q: What does consumer protection mean to you?

Informing consumers of their rights and keeping them safe while they are seeking access to care that will hopefully improve their quality of life. This benefits them and our licensing population by encouraging those in the physical therapy profession to provide the best care possible.

Both Reynoso and Laxton have been with PTBC for almost 20 years and we thank them for all of their service and all their hard work and dedication to protecting the consumers of California.

BEWARE OF SCAMMERS



If you're contacted by someone about your license and want to know whether it's a scam or if there is an official investigation, please call our office at (916) 561-8215 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

PTBC is warning licensees and the public of a widespread fraud scheme in which scammers impersonate PTBC employees in an attempt to extort money or steal personal identifiable information.

Scammers are using PTBC's letterhead and appearing to call from PTBC's office. They claim to be contacting people regarding an investigation, but their intent is to steal your money. While these scammers may be skilled at appearing to contact you from PTBC, you can tell that their claims are false because they do not align with PTBC's investigation process.

We can't say it enough—PTBC will never ask for money over the phone. If you are subject to an investigation, you will be notified by an official letter before any action is taken. That means you will never suddenly be informed your license has been suspended without first being informed an investigation has been opened. PTBC will never ask you to pay a fine until an investigation has been completed. Additionally, PTBC will not ask you for sensitive personal information over the phone. Do not provide anyone your birth date, social security number, or credit or debit card numbers.

Please be aware that these scams often have multiple parts:

- You receive a call, letter, or email notifying you that your license is suspended, and demand you must pay a fine or fees to reinstate your license.

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- These messages may come from an imposter claiming to be a PTBC employee or other U.S. government agency official. If by phone, it may appear to be coming from PTBC's main line, (916) 561-8200, or if by mail, a letter with PTBC's letterhead.
- They may continue to suggest reasons for you to pay more fees or fines. It is all part of the scam.

Scammers may contact you by phone, mail, email, text message/SMS, social media, messaging apps, or through other online channels. Scams can occur in person, at home, or at a business. Here are some common signs that you're being scammed:

- You are asked to pay upfront fines or fees.
- You are being pressured to act now and, in this most recent scam involving PTBC, the scammers will threaten that PTBC will open an investigation if you do not send your payment. Scammers don't want you to take the time to do research or to think too carefully before parting with your money.
- The emails sent may even appear to be from real government email addresses, but if you look further, the email used is not a ".gov" email.

If you suspect you are being scammed, report it!

If the caller states they are from the DEA, report the scam using the DEA's Extortion Scam online reporting form: www.dea.gov/stories/2019/06/11/alert-extortion-scam-targeting-dea-registrants.

If the caller states they are from the FBI, report the scam using the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center reporting form: www.ic3.gov/default.aspx.

If the phone number of the caller appears to be a PTBC phone number, report the scam using the Federal Communications Commission's consumer complaint form: <https://consumercomplaints.fcc.gov/hc/en-us/articles/115002234203-Unwanted-Calls-Phone->

The Federal Trade Commission provides recovery steps and takes reports at www.reportfraud.ftc.gov. The Commission shares reports with more than 3,000 law enforcement agencies.

For any victims who have given personally identifiable information like a social security number to the caller can learn how to protect against identity theft at www.identitytheft.gov.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: SAN DIEGO MESA COLLEGE



San Diego Mesa College was initially accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) in 1971. For the years 2022 and 2023, San Diego Mesa College, on average, had a first-time licensure pass rate of 84.1% and a graduation rate of 85.21%. For the years of 2021 and 2022 San Diego Mesa had an average employment rate of 98%.

PTBC is invited every year to San Diego Mesa College to provide a two-hour workshop that goes over a step-by-step presentation on how to apply for licensure, PTALA, and continuing competency requirements. Staff also explains the differences between PTBC's mandate of consumer protection and other organizations, such as the California Physical Therapy Association (CPTA), that play a role in the profession of physical therapy.

During and after each presentation, there is a question and answer session where students can ask PTBC staff anything they want to know about their road to licensure or the laws and regulations surrounding the profession. This gives the students an opportunity to gain a better understanding of the Physical Therapy Practice Act and more information on what is needed to apply for licensure as well as what happens after they are licensed.

PTBC thanks San Diego Mesa College for continuing to invite staff back to provide this workshop. We look forward to these presentations every year and meeting each new cohort.

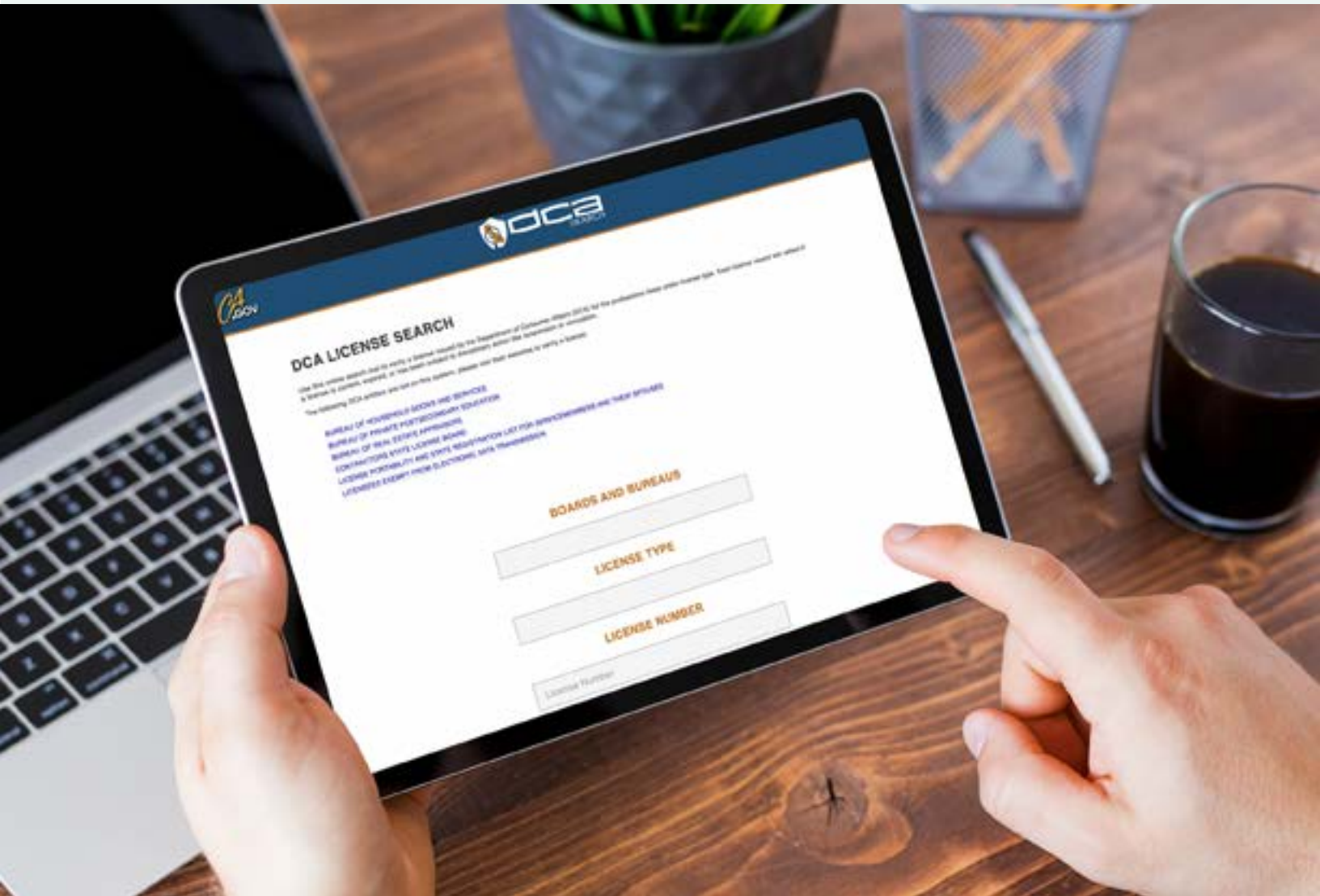
LICENSE VERIFICATION HAS GONE DIGITAL

PTBC aims to make license verification effective and efficient for consumers and licensees. PTBC no longer issues pocket licenses upon initial licensure or renewal. Pocket licenses may not reflect a licensee's current status as it may change within the two-year license period, and they do not display enforcement action taken against a license, if any.

Current license status and enforcement action information is available at the DCA [License Search tool, an online license verification system](#).

Consumers, employers, or any interested party can access license information online 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can access the DCA License Search system on the home page of the PTBC website at www.ptbc.ca.gov. Look for the icon that says "Verify a License."

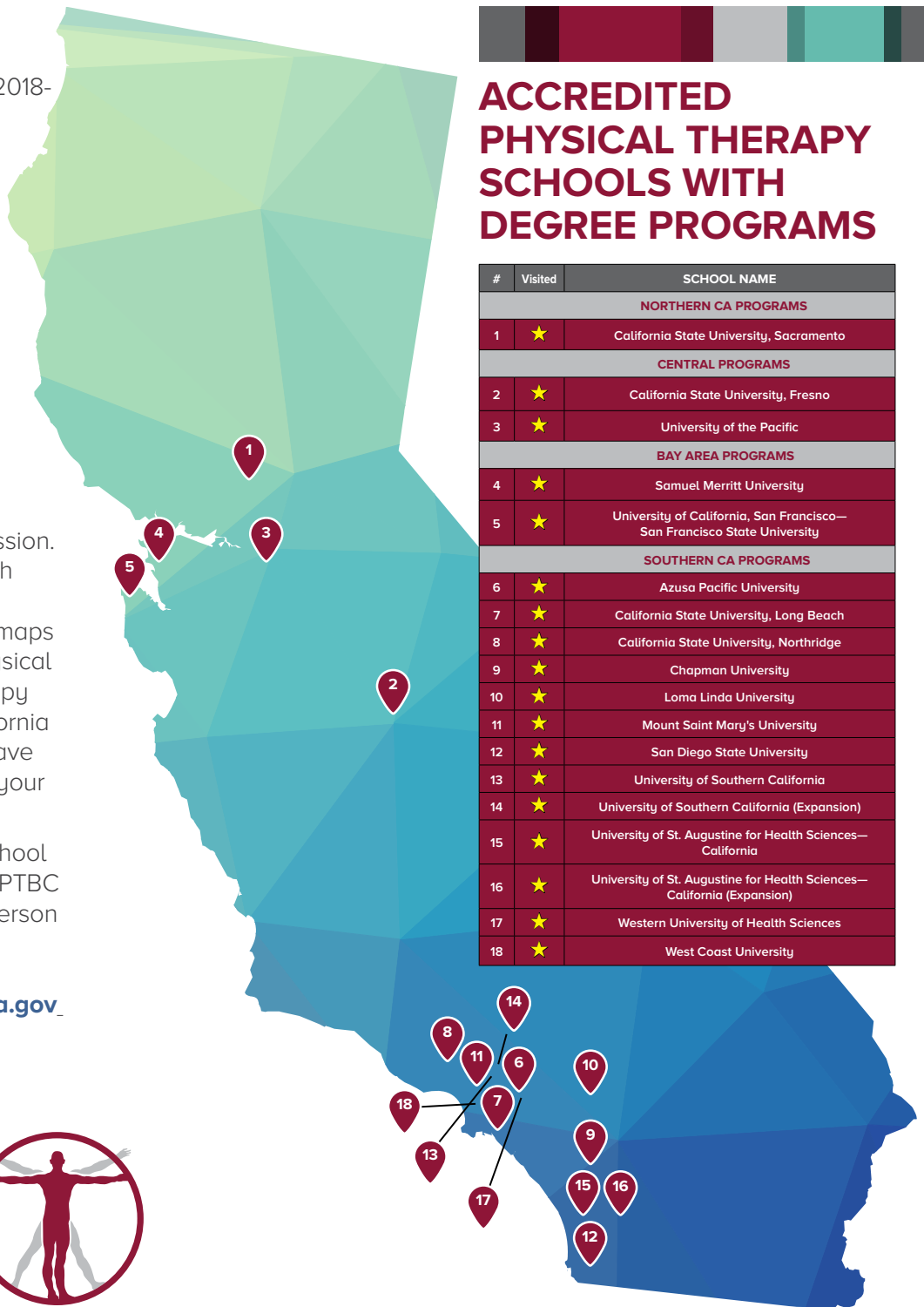

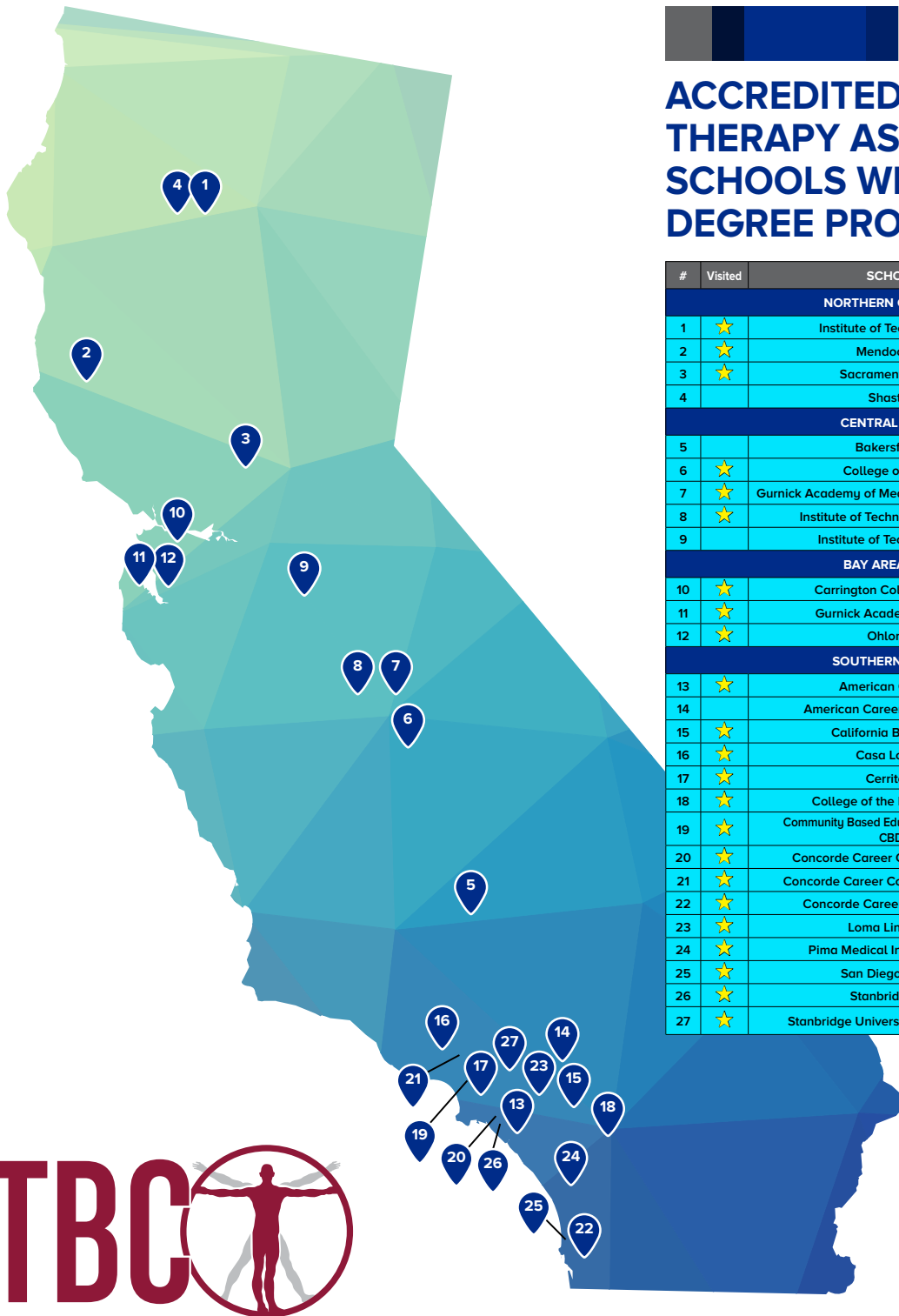

SUBSTANCE ABUSE REHABILITATION HOTLINE

Physical therapists (PTs) and physical therapist assistants (PTAs) are not immune from the diseases of chemical dependency. Experts estimate that at least 10% of the general population will have a problem with alcohol or drugs at some point in their lives. Health care professionals, including PTs and PTAs, may be particularly susceptible to substance abuse problems due to the stresses of working in a health care environment and due to an increased opportunity to obtain controlled substances.

Many PTs and PTAs who experience problems with chemical dependency can find the help and support they need without involvement from PTBC.

If chemical dependency problems are left untreated, they may eventually jeopardize patient health and safety. They can also threaten the life of the person afflicted.

In these cases, it becomes imperative that individuals who detect a chemical dependency health problem in a PT or PTA take action. Without intervention, diseases have predictable courses and outcomes. The PTBC's Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program aims to identify symptoms, intervene, and change the outcomes.

The Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program also provides an effective alternative to the traditional disciplinary process.

PTBC has a voluntary and confidential program to help licensees overcome the disease of chemical dependency. For more information regarding the California Recovery Program, visit www.ptbc.ca.gov/licensees/rehabilitation.shtml.

Glossary of Terms

Accusations: Charges filed against a licensee alleging violation(s) of the Physical Therapy Practice Act.

Interim Suspension Order: An order issued upon petition, suspending a licensee from all or specified part of their practice of, or assisting in the provision of, physical therapy.

Petition to Revoke Probation: Charges filed against a probationer seeking revocation of their physical therapy or physical therapy assistant license based upon violation(s) of probation.

Probationary License: Where good cause exists to deny a license, the licensing agency has the option to issue a conditional license subject to probationary terms and conditions.

Public Letter of Reprimand: In lieu of filing a formal accusation, the Board may, pursuant to B & P Code section 2660.3, upon stipulation or agreement by the licensee, issue a public letter of reprimand. If the licensee does not agree to the issuance of the letter, the Board shall not issue the letter and may proceed to file a formal accusation. A public letter of reprimand is considered disciplinary action.

Statement of Issues Filed: Charges filed against an applicant due to alleged violation(s) of the Physical Therapy Practice Act. If found to be true, the charges may result in discipline.

Surrender of License: The licensee surrenders their license to the Board, subject to acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board, and the licensee is prohibited from engaging in the practice, or assisting in the provision, of physical therapy.

Stipulated Decision: Negotiated settlements waiving court appeals.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS—CITATIONS



A citation and fine is an administrative action by the Physical Therapy Board of California that may address relatively minor violations of the Physical Therapy Practice Act that would not necessarily warrant discipline to protect the public. Citation and fine orders are not disciplinary

actions but are still matters of public record. Citations remain on a licensee's file for five years and are then purged. By law, payment of a fine is considered satisfactory resolution of all violations contained in the citation.
