PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



President Karen Brandon

California is a state that has always represented a frontier mentality. We work hard, we figure things out—even with limited resources—and that spirit often puts us at the forefront of innovation, diversity, and progress. By nature, physical therapists are problem solvers. We are not only tasked with treating acute and chronic conditions, but also with guiding patients to understand their health and navigate a rapidly shifting medical landscape.

Today, we are living in a moment where advances in technology are reshaping our profession. Wearable biosensors, motion analysis, VR simulation, the warp speed development of Electronic Medical Record (EMR) systems, and the expansion of telehealth—these are no longer futuristic concepts; they are tools of daily practice. These advances

These are not theoretical concerns—they are urgent ones. Consumer protection must remain the foundation of our practice. Every new tool, every model of care, must be measured against safety, efficacy, and ethical responsibility. Innovation should expand access and improve quality, not deepen inequities or add burdens to patients. Our role is to ensure that the public can trust physical therapy to remain safe, effective, and centered on people—even as our practice evolves.

The next generation of physical therapists will inherit a practice environment that demands adaptability and courage. They will need to integrate evidence-based science with human connection, balancing

data-driven tools with the empathy and listening that define our profession. They will be called to advocate for patients across complex systems where access is too often determined by zip code or socioeconomic status. They will need to lead in prevention, wellness, and population health—broadening our impact while strengthening public trust.

Payment models will continue to undervalue rehabilitation and prevention. Workforce shortages will test our resilience and well-being. And the demand for inclusive, culturally informed care will only grow as California remains one of the most diverse states in the nation. Meeting these challenges requires integrity in every step we take, as well as investment in mentorship, advocacy, and continuing education so the next generation of therapists is not only clinically excellent but also prepared to lead.

California has always been a proving ground for bold ideas. From early adoption of telehealth to elevating continuing education requirements, our state sets the standard for what is possible. Together, we can ensure that innovation in physical therapy is both visionary and responsible—expanding access, protecting consumers, and uplifting every community we serve.

My charge to you is this: Let us not simply adapt to change but shape it. Let us build the bridge to a future we may never fully see, empowering the next generation to rise not only to the challenges they inherit, but to imagine and create a world where physical therapy leads in redefining health, healing, and hope.


The Board convenes in public meetings to conduct the business of PTBC, make regulatory and enforcement decisions, and address other issues within their jurisdiction.

Continuing competency hours may be awarded for attending board meetings in person to encourage

physical therapists and physical therapist assistants to learn more about the issues and operations of PTBC.

Can't attend a meeting? While you won't receive continuing competency credit, you can still view the meeting actions via webcast. Become a Facebook friend of PTBC and you'll receive notification and a link to gain access on the meeting day.

DO YOU WANT TO HOST A BOARD MEETING?



Who is the Physical Therapy Board of California (PTBC)?

The Physical Therapy Board of California (PTBC) is a government agency within the Department of Consumer Affairs. PTBC licenses and disciplines physical therapists and physical therapist assistants. PTBC provides three principal types of consumer services: verifies education and background prior to licensure, shares information about the practice of physical therapy by physical therapists and physical therapist assistants, and investigates complaints against physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.

Board Meetings

Board meetings are mandated to three board meetings a year. Typically, PTBC conducts four meetings a year in Northern and Southern California. Board meetings are usually two days long, and the public is highly encouraged to attend.

Benefits of Hosting a Board Meeting

- Consumers in the area can be educated on the practice of physical therapy.
- Licensees in the area can attend and receive continuing competency credit while having their voices heard on topics being discussed.
- Students and applicants can attend in between classes and learn how PTBC operates and how decisions are made that affect the profession.
- Name recognition for the hosting location.

Mission:

To protect the people of California by the effective administration of the Physical Therapy Practice Act.

Vision:

The Board is the standard of excellence in consumer protection.



DO WE HAVE YOUR EMAIL ADDRESS?

Licensees are required to provide the PTBC with an email address if the licensee has one. Email is an efficient conduit for sharing information between PTBC and its applicants and licensees. PTBC will be able to communicate regarding the status of applications, renewals, and requests for various PTBC services; provide law and regulation updates; and disseminate important PTBC news directly to each applicant and licensee—from PTBC to your door (or email inbox). It doesn't get much easier! The PTBC hopes this accelerated delivery and exchange of information

will decrease processing times in all aspects of PTBC's programs facilitate licensees keeping apprised of laws and regulations and PTBC activities. Moreover, with the transition to the BreEZe system, email will be the standard method of communication. You can submit/update your email address using BreEZe or submit your address change with BreEZe. You may also submit your email address in writing to the PTBC—please include your name and license number.

Why Your Presence Matters: The Benefits of Attending PTBC Board Meetings

Board meetings aren't just about procedure, they're opportunities to engage by:

- **Earning Continuing Competency Credits:** To incentivize engagement, PTBC offers two continuing competency credits per meeting that licensees attend.
- **Shaping Policy With Your Voice:** Public comments may spark future agenda items or influence Board priorities.

- **Building Strategic Connections:** Meet decision-makers, advocates, and peers who share your commitment to public protection and professional excellence.

Attending isn't just symbolic, it's strategic. When you're in the room, you're part of the discussion.

Speaking Up: What Happens After Public Comment

PTBC encourages public participation and values the input of stakeholders, licensees, and members of the public. Individuals may offer public comment during designated portions of each Board meeting.

In accordance with the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act, the Board may listen to but not discuss or act on any matter raised during public comment that is not on the published agenda. However, comments may be acknowledged and noted for potential follow-up.

Public input plays a vital role in guiding the Board's work and priorities. PTBC thanks all individuals who take the time to engage and share their perspectives.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: GURNICK ACADEMY



Gurnick Academy of Medical Arts was initially accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) in 2014. For calendar years 2023 and 2024, Gurnick had an average first-time licensure pass rate of 73.2% and a graduation rate of 94.5%. For 2023, Gurnick had an employment rate of 95%.

PTBC is invited every year to Gurnick to provide a two-hour workshop that goes over a step-by-step presentation on how to apply for licensure, PTLA, and continuing competency requirements. Staff also explains the differences between PTBC's mandate of consumer protection and other organizations, such as the California Physical Therapy Association (CPTA), that play a role in the profession of physical therapy.

During and after each presentation, there is a Q&A where students can ask PTBC staff anything they want to know about their road to licensure or the laws and regulations surrounding the profession. This gives the students an opportunity to gain a better understanding

of the Physical Therapy Practice Act and more information on what is needed to apply for licensure as well as what happens after they are licensed.

PTBC would like to thank Gurnick Academy of Medical Arts for continuing to invite staff back to provide this workshop. We look forward to these presentations every year and meeting each new cohort.

PERSONNEL, TRAINING, AND TRAVEL LIAISON

Q: How long have you been with PTBC?

Q: How long have you been with PTBC?

Q: What is your title, and can you briefly describe your responsibilities?

However, with this role, I manage procurement, asset management, and records management for the Board, acting as the liaison with the DCA Business Services Office. ROLES OF PTBC, CPTA, AND FSBPT

Who's Who in Physical Therapy? PTBC, APTA/CPTA, and FSBPT Explained


Physical Therapy Board of California (PTBC)

The PTBC is a regulatory body established by the California Legislature with the primary mission of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public. Unlike professional associations that represent the interests of their members, PTBC operates independently to ensure that individuals practicing physical therapy in the state meet the required standards of competence and ethical conduct. Through licensing, enforcement, and oversight, PTBC is committed to upholding public trust and maintaining accountability within the profession.

To meet its primary purpose of public protection, PTBC does the following:

- Enforces the laws and regulations governing the practice of physical therapy.
- Promotes a national examination reflective of current practice and a jurisprudence examination of laws and regulations governing the practice of physical therapy in California.
- Ensures competency of physical therapists and physical therapist assistants through the application process and regulates the use of physical therapy aides.
- Investigates complaints on licensees and the unlicensed practice of physical therapy resulting in disciplinary action or issuing citations when necessary.
- Requires continuing education (continuing competency).
- Operates by a governing body (the Board) that includes public and licensed members who meet openly.

American Physical Therapy Association/California Physical Therapy Association (APTA/CPTA)

The American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) and its California Chapter, the California Physical Therapy Association (CPTA), are professional organizations dedicated to representing and advancing the interests of physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, and physical therapy students.

The concentration of APTA and CPTA is to:

- Promote and support the practitioners and the profession.
- Promote a code of ethics for members.
- Offer courses for continued competence.
- Accredits schools through the Commission on Accreditation of Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE)—The Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) accredit entry-level physical therapist and physical therapist assistant education programs. Although appointed by the APTA Board of Directors, CAPTE functions independently in all its actions, including program accreditation status decisions. Physical therapy education accreditation is a peer review mechanism designed to assure educational quality.

Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT)

The Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) represents 53 licensing jurisdictions, which include all 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Its membership consists of these jurisdictional licensing boards, whose representatives participate in FSBPT's governance and decision making processes.

The focus of the FSBPT is as follows:

- Ensuring the National Physical Therapy Examination is reliable, defensible, secure, and valid.

- Maintaining programs and services responsive to the member's needs.
- Promotes effective regulation in physical therapy while respecting states' rights and responsibilities.
- Provides educational programs and products for Board members, administrators and the public.
- Takes a limited leadership role within the regulatory, professional, and related communities.
- Has a responsibility to its member licensing jurisdictions to ensure long-term organizational and financial stability.



PTBC HAS ELIMINATED THE POCKET LICENSE!

PTBC has made license verification more effective and efficient for consumers and licensees. As of July 2020, PTBC no longer issues pocket licenses upon initial licensure or renewal. Pocket licenses may not reflect a licensee's current status, as it may change within the two-year license period, and they do not display any enforcement action taken against a license. Current license status and enforcement action information is available on the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) License Search, an online license verification system. Consumers, employers, or any interested party can access license information online, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You can access the DCA License Search system on the homepage of the PTBC [website](#).















SUBSTANCE ABUSE REHABILITATION HOTLINE

Physical therapists (PTs) and physical therapist assistants (PTAs) are not immune from the diseases of chemical dependency. Experts estimate that at least 10% of the general population will have a problem with alcohol or drugs at some point in their lives. Health care professionals, including PTs and PTAs, may be particularly susceptible to substance abuse problems due to the stresses of working in a health care environment and due to an increased opportunity to obtain controlled substances.

Many PTs and PTAs who experience problems with chemical dependency can find the help and support they need without involvement from PTBC.

If chemical dependency problems are left untreated, they may eventually jeopardize patient health and safety. They can also threaten the life of the person afflicted.

In these cases, it becomes imperative that individuals who detect a chemical dependency health problem in a PT or PTA take action. Without intervention, diseases have predictable courses and outcomes. The PTBC's Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program aims to identify symptoms, intervene, and change the outcomes.

The Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program also provides an effective alternative to the traditional disciplinary process.



TELEHEALTH AND PHYSICAL THERAPY: WHAT'S ALLOWED IN CALIFORNIA AND WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT WORKING IN MULTIPLE STATES?

The use of telehealth increased over the years with the growth of high-speed internet, enhanced video audio capabilities, and the widespread proliferation of smartphones and other connected devices; then it surged with the COVID-19 pandemic. Now, telehealth is a typical care delivery model, including for physical therapy, and it is important to recognize treating patients remotely requires not only an understanding of the regulations governing telehealth but also the importance of the patient's physical location. However, treating patients remotely requires not only an understanding of the regulations governing telehealth in physical therapy but also the importance of the patient's physical location.

As an early adopter of telehealth in healthcare delivery, California enacted the Telehealth Advancement Act of 2011 (BPC §2290.5), which laid the groundwork for telehealth by defining it and setting standards for its use. The Act requires informed consent and ensures that telehealth services are held to the same standards as in-person services. Providing physical therapy services in-person or remotely in the state requires that all physical therapy practitioners hold a valid California physical therapist (PT) license and comply with the Act as defined and regulated by the Physical Therapy Board of California PTBC.

A valid California PT license allows the licensee to provide physical therapy services to patients located within California whether those services are in-person or via telehealth. The services that may be provided remotely include evaluations, assessments, education, consultation, treatment plans, exercise programs, and treatment strategies, among other services that do not require hands-on techniques. Before beginning physical therapy telehealth services, it is required that informed consent is obtained from the patient. Informed consent explains the nature of telehealth, its potential risks and benefits, and ensures that the patient understands and agrees to the process.



If a patient relocates outside of California, even temporarily, the patient then is under the jurisdiction of the area in which the patient is located. A California licensed PT no longer has the authority granted by PTBC to provide physical therapy telehealth services to the patient. In a situation such as this, contact the physical therapy licensing authority for the state where the patient is located to determine that state's licensure requirements and telehealth regulations. Each state has its own rules regarding telehealth and licensure, and practicing without the appropriate permission or license can lead to disciplinary action or legal issues.

Telehealth has become an integral part of physical therapy, offering flexibility and accessibility to both patients and practitioners. California has supported the adoption of telehealth into physical therapy by establishing laws and guidelines that define how telehealth can be used safely and effectively in clinical practice. However, it's crucial for physical therapists to stay informed about the varying regulations across different states, especially when patients relocate. By adhering to licensure requirements and telehealth standards, physical therapists can continue to provide high-quality care, ensuring that their patients receive the best possible outcomes, no matter where they are located.

Glossary of Terms

Accusations: Charges filed against a licensee alleging violation(s) of the Physical Therapy Practice Act.

Interim Suspension Order: An order issued upon petition, suspending a licensee from all or specified part of their practice of, or assisting in the provision, of physical therapy.

Petition to Revoke Probation: Charges filed against a probationer seeking revocation of their physical therapy or physical therapy assistant license based upon violation(s) of probation.

Probationary License: Where good cause exists to deny a license, the licensing agency has the option to issue a conditional license subject to probationary terms and conditions.

Public Letter of Reprimand: In lieu of filing a formal accusation, the Board may, pursuant to B & P Code section 2660.3, upon stipulation or agreement by the licensee, issue a public letter of reprimand. If the licensee does not agree to the issuance of the letter, the Board shall not issue the letter and may proceed to file a formal accusation. A public letter of reprimand is considered disciplinary action.

Statement of Issues Filed: Charges filed against an applicant due to alleged violation(s) of the Physical Therapy Practice Act. If found to be true, the charges may result in discipline.

Surrender of License: The licensee surrenders their license to the Board, subject to acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board, and the licensee is prohibited from engaging in the practice, or assisting in the provision, of physical therapy.

Stipulated Decision: Negotiated settlements waiving court appeals.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS—CITATIONS



A Citation and Fine is an administrative action by which PTBC may address relatively minor violations of the Physical Therapy Practice Act that would not necessarily warrant discipline in order to protect the public. Citation and Fine Orders ARE NOT disciplinary actions but are

matters of public record. Citations remain on a licensee's file for five years and are then purged. By law, payment of a fine is considered satisfactory resolution of all violations contained in the citation.
